



Administrators AGM Report 2008/ 2009

In 2008/2009 we had a total of 362 players take part in WYSC.

As of August 25th 2009 we have 280 players registered, with the constant increase in soccer's popularity this may be the year we reach 400 players.

Our season began in fall 2008 with play in the Squamish Youth Soccer Associations fall league. We generally participate in only the fall part of their season and therefore scores are not counted but this year for the first time we entered a U14 team in the whole league – this team played through rain and snow in spring 2009 and won their division! This year U14 girls plan to also enter a “full season team in Squamish.

The Green River league began on May 2nd 2009 and ran for several weeks with wind up events on June 13th. In the Green river League everything

went well with great end of season events. The younger age groups U7 & U9 had a good season with growing improvements. U11-U14 enjoyed a complete round robin schedule with playoff at end of season event with GRL awards distributed. Unfortunately, the senior divisions were unsuccessful in completing a full round robin schedule therefore, the plaques and awards were not distributed this year, but that they ended the season with a fun mixed round robin games. In the senior divisions – U18 boy's conflict with rep teams and U18 girls with disruption caused due to high school provincials. These disruptions in scheduled games need to be kept in mind for next years GRL. In spring 2010 a review of the scheduling for these age groups could ensure we are still providing a program for all involved in community soccer

We applied for and successfully received 3 grants in 2008/9,

- 1) \$1000 From BC soccer Association to hold a U12 Tournament over Thanksgiving 2009 – this was a joint application with Pemberton Youth Soccer Association.
- 2) \$ 9500.00 From the RMOW to further player development in the club
- 3) \$ 5500.00 From the Whistler Blackcomb Foundation to refit the storage container, purchase more balls, portable goals and uniforms

These grants enabled us to grow even more a club this year; the most notable change was WYSC hiring a Technical Director Steve September.
