The Green River league started this year on April 24<sup>th</sup> for U9 Boys , U11 Girls and Boys and U14 Girls and Boys. These teams played in a league with Pemberton and some Squamish teams until June 26<sup>th</sup> .

U7 Boys and Girls and U9 girls started playing outdoors in Whistler on May 29<sup>th</sup> after the Whitecaps camp and the Victoria Day weekend.

U18 Girls & U18 boys did not participate in the GRL this year. The U18 girls was preparing for the High School Provincial championship.

The Whitecaps camp was held in Whistler this year and had 146 participants for the 2 day camp on May 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> 89 of the players were from WYSC, 19 from PYSA and 38 from other clubs.

We held a very successful joint U12 tournament with PYSA in Pemberton on May 30<sup>th</sup> using grant money from BC soccer to pay for refereeing and a souvenir t- shirt for all players.

The spring soccer season ended for all players with a fun day for all players on June 26<sup>th</sup> .

Saibo held another very successful camp with 61 players in the week of July 12<sup>th</sup> and Sandi Potis and Don Sparks also returned in the week of August 16<sup>th</sup> to hold a camp for 40 players.

Soccer started on Sept 11<sup>th</sup> this year with games for U11 to U18 teams mostly played in Squamish. Everything seemed to go well for the participating teams – the problems of last year with unequal teams seemed to be resolved. Almost all games have finished now with only the U14 girls still playing until November 20<sup>th</sup> .

U7 and U9 teams attended the annual soccer Jambouree in Pemberton on Oct 17<sup>th</sup> .

In March 2010 we received payment of a grant from the Whistler Blackcomb foundation for \$5500.00 this was for purchase of new uniforms and amenities in the storage shed. We also were granted \$9500.00 Community Enrichment grant by the RMOW – this money is earmarked to use for developing players skills, offering more coach training and increasing our membership.
